



# **Wokingham Without Parish Council**

## **Strategic vision 2018-2023**



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## Introduction

This document sets out the broad vision and aspirations of Wokingham Without Parish Council (hereby referred to as ‘the council’).

It lists the aims and objectives of the council and provides the policy framework within which the elected members take decisions and the officers (staff) conduct their day-to-day work.

## Delivering our strategic vision

In order to bring focus to these objectives, the council has divided its activities into 7 areas. These in turn are each supported by a separate action plan which sets out short, medium and long term projects to help achieve the strategic vision:

- Access, travel and transport
- Communication and community engagement
- Improving the environment
- Leisure, sport and well-being
- Parish council organisation, facilities and services
- Supporting and strengthening our community
- Working with neighbouring parishes and authorities for the benefit of residents

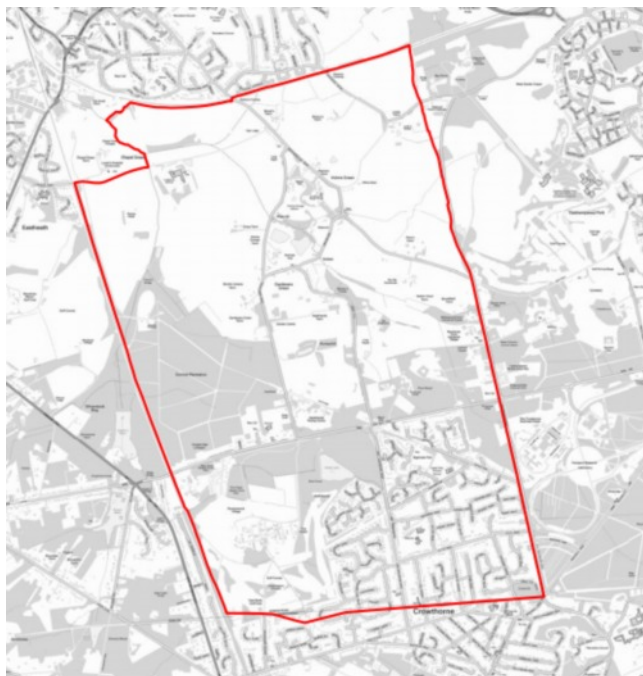


## The Parish Council

Wokingham Without Parish Council is an elected body of 13 local people (currently 11 members and 2 vacancies) with a remit to represent residents of Wokingham Without Parish.

It strives to provide a strong, local voice on decisions, services and issues which impact the everyday lives of people in this community.

The parish council has a range of powers including looking after Pinewood and St Sebastian's Memorial Hall, commenting (but not deciding) local planning applications, making financial grants, providing playgrounds and recreation space and campaigning on behalf of local residents for improvements to local facilities.





## Access, travel and transport

The council wishes to encourage well-connected communities and improve access to the services and facilities residents require.

The council will:

- Lobby for improvements to highways, road safety and congestion within the parish
- Work to improve the safety, condition and connectivity of pedestrian and cycle routes into and through the parish
- Lobby to ensure plans for new developments incorporate adequate provision of public transport, walking and cycling routes
- Work to sustain retail, community buildings and leisure areas through improved connectivity and appropriate parking



## Communication and community engagement

The council strives to fulfil its role as the voice of its residents, and aims to encourage residents to participate more in the decision making process.

The council is committed to raising its profile and taking a strong local leadership role.

The council will:

- Work to improve communications with residents, using both traditional and electronic methods to reach out to the broadest cross section of the community
- Work to raise its profile within the local community
- Increase awareness of the council's responsibilities
- Consult with residents to determine what facilities they would like
- Raise awareness of the council's existing facilities
- Provide opportunities for residents to meet with local councillors
- Through the development of the Neighbourhood Plan, consult with the community on policies to guide future development



## Protecting and improving the environment

The council recognises extensive housing development in the area has a detrimental impact on the environment. It appreciates that the parish's countryside setting contributes to people's quality of life, and a balance is required to meet the social, economic and environmental needs of residents.

The council will:

- Work to protect the parish's rural character
- Develop a Neighbourhood Development Plan for the parish, to identify and protect valued features of the natural environment
- Lobby for improvements to local air quality
- Lobby for the provision of affordable housing for local people
- Work in an environmentally friendly way
- Continue to review and comment on local planning applications, as a statutory consultee
- Invest in the development of the natural environment



## Leisure, sport and health

The council recognises that engaging in sport and leisure is good for health and well-being. It has an important role to play in providing community spaces and facilities for residents, and believes that this is one of the most important services that the parish currently provides.

The council will:

- Seek to ensure that Wokingham Without continues to have thriving, high quality leisure facilities
- Encourage organisations that support residents' health and well-being
- Continue to support and improve facilities at Pinewood
- Continue to improve facilities at St Sebastian's Memorial Hall





## Parish council facilities and services

The council will:

- Provide well-managed, value for money services to the parish
- Use local labour and suppliers wherever possible
- Develop long-term business and financial plans to support the implementation of its strategic plan
- Consult residents on what facilities they would like, and consider how these can be provided
- Endeavour to ensure that all its policies and actions are transparent
- Work to generate income opportunities to keep the burden of costs on residents to a minimum
- Ensure that both staff and councillors are equipped with knowledge and skills
- Improve the council office and parish council facilities



## Supporting and strengthening our community

The council wants the parish of Wokingham Without to be an active, vibrant and cohesive community. It recognises the challenges new residents will face in feeling they are a part of the existing community.

The council sees a role in helping deliver a thriving, integrated community.

The council will:

- Work to identify and implement solutions that address local issues
- Make funding for community organisations available through the council's Community Grant Scheme
- Work to facilitate and improve community participation
- Work to maintain a culture and ethos for the council with social impact at its heart.



## **Working with neighbouring parishes and authorities for the benefit of residents**

The council recognises the national situation with funding for local authorities, and the resulting pressure on non-statutory services.

The council is keen to explore how working with neighbouring parishes and local authorities can help protect the delivery of services valued by the local community

The council will:

- Develop stronger links with neighbouring councils to identify common issues and ways of working together effectively to deliver solutions
- Look to achieve cost savings and facility improvements through collaboration with partners
- Consider opportunities for joint funding of projects where this is in residents' interests
- Consider providing services to neighbouring parishes as a means to generate additional revenue
